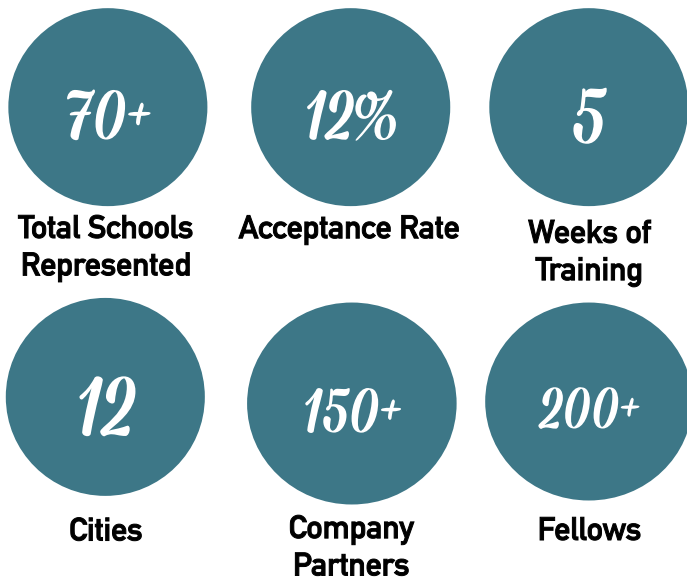


The VFA Breakdown

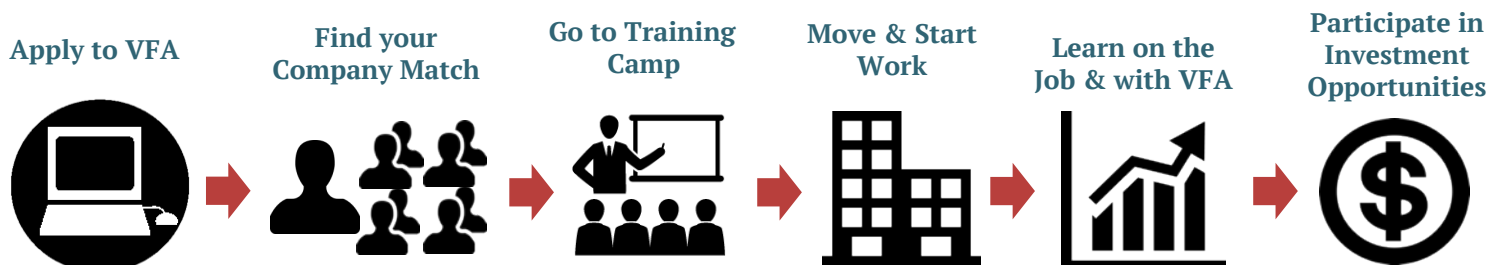

- ✓ Each year, VFA sends 5-15 Fellows to each current VFA city, along with expansion cities
- ✓ At the end of the Fellowship, Fellows have access to seed money for companies they start
- ✓ Training Camp takes place from June-July for five weeks, then Fellows begin their jobs throughout August
- ✓ VFA expands to “emerging” cities with burgeoning entrepreneurial ecosystems and a low cost of living (support for VFA in the community is also taken into consideration)
- ✓ VFA chooses companies based on excellent leadership, a high-quality product, and a good “feel”—meaning somewhere we think would be a great working and learning environment for the Fellow
