- I. **Audit and Accountability Committee** shall provide guidance and oversight of the Office of the City Auditor in the performance of its responsibilities, including municipal audits. Additionally, this committee shall review and provide policy recommendations that promote transparency, accountability, and trust in City functions. Included in their charge will be the review of high-profile contracts. Per ordinance, two of the five members are citizens.

Additionally, the committee shall oversee activities related to the stewardship of San Antonio’s unique artistic, cultural, and historic heritage.

The committee will also review all aspects of the City's investments in education, workforce development, and training as well as provide recommendations and policy guidance that further San Antonio’s “smart city” goals, such as enhancing cyber security, promoting digital inclusion, expanding municipal broadband, and pursuing economic opportunity.
